## Energy-saving equipment withdrawn from the market

'LGT energy savers- 3 phase' have been withdrawn from the market after they were found to be non-compliant when tested against the applicable European Standards, the Malta Standards Authority said. They were also found to be dangerous as they cause electrocution or start fires.

The MSA said it was advising consumers not to use this equipment and to return it to the place of purchase.

Action would be taken should the equipment be found on the market, the MSA said.
